## ALEXANDER THE GREAT AS A HISTORICAL PERSON

Alexander the Great isn't just a historical personality for Greece. He is the incarnation of union, long before the politicians of the 20th century unite the entire world. He had very unique character and ideologies, very important to human history. Not only he was an invisible general, a genius in political and strategically matters, but also an excellent character with great spirit. He was the man that united almost the whole world back then, and gave the light of the Greek civilization to Asian nations. He made the Greek language national, and set an effort of civilizing the barbarian race. His purpose is proved by the amount of philosophers, scientists and architects he had with him in his reign.

Alexander the Great was born on July 356 B.C., at Pela the first capital of the Macedonian nation. His father was Philippos the 2nd, king of Macedonia, and his mother was Olympia. At Alexander's 13 years, his father summoned the philosopher Aristotelis to be in charge of Alexander's education. Aristotelis taught Alexander the phrase "in my father I owe many, in my teacher I owe the most". An approval of Alexander's bravery is the way he handled a sturdy horse, Vukefala. Vukefala was brought to king Philippos by a Thesal merchant, no man were able to handle Vukefala until Alexander realized that the horse feared

it's own shadow and so Alexander turned the horse's head towards the sun and waited for it to relax, and then he ridded Vukefala for about 20 years. At 336 B.C. and after king Philippos murder, Alexander became king at the age of 20. Since then and until 323 B.C. (where Alexander died probably from fever) he marched in the whole world as a winner and founded cities that became places of scientific and merchandise meaning. His name remains in the historic memory of all the civilizations he conquered, not only with his sword but also with his brilliant character.

For Greece he was a very special symbol through the ages and that's why he is referred to many stories and legends we were told when we were kids... There are many different versions of one story:

- -The sisters of Alexander the Great
